The /s/-signature

The /s/ is called the S-signature. It represents the physical signature when the physical signature is not appropriate to publish. The convention is to place the printed name, title, and designations below the signature as usual but represent the signature above the title with the /s/ just as you would a handwritten signature on a document. One example of where you would see this is in a public company’s annual report, in place of the signatures of the board of directors.
