Halloween Safety Tips

- Plan costumes that are bright, reflective, and well-fitting. To prevent hazards, shoes should fit well and costumes should not hang to the ground.
 - Add reflective tape or striping to candy bags or costumes to help others, especially drivers, see children better.
 - Make sure to have flashlights available for each person and carry extra batteries.
 - Never let a child trick-or-treat by themselves. Carry a cell phone and teach children how to call 9-1-1 for help in an emergency.
- Remember to keep your porch light off if you do not plan to give out candy and teach the little ones to go only to those homes with their light on.
